## History

Thanks to all of you who have been an integral part of this Foundation's history, and who will be the key to the Foundation's future.

The East Central University Foundation, Inc., was established in February of 1970 with a total contribution of \$2000 from five alumni and one University President. *Did they have any idea of the dynamic, positive impact that their actions would have on the future of ECU, its faculty, staff and students?* Probably not, but from that modest beginning, the support given to ECU programs has grown to include an asset level of over \$23 million with yearly scholarships being awarded to over 400 students, and many worthwhile activities from faculty positions to new facilities being funded through investment earnings as well as through special fundraising appeals.

The five alumni (R. Burl Harris, W. Harvey Faust, James A. Thomas Sr., Hugh Warren, and Oscar L. Parker) shared a dream with Dr. Stanley Wagner, who was the President of ECU in 1970, to establish a Foundation which would help attract to the University and the Ada

community a group of students who exceeded the academic ability of their peers, and who were deserving and in need of assistance while attending ECU. Dr. Wagner, a lover of the fine arts, also hoped that the Foundation would provide a means of assistance to bring certain cultural activities to the community and the University that were unique and stimulating.

For the first twenty years, the Foundation experienced slow and steady growth. By 1990, the endowment level had grown to approximately \$2 million, and the income from investments was used almost exclusively to fund scholarships to incoming freshmen at ECU. There have been fundraising campaigns and an increase in benevolent donors throughout the years that have aided the Foundation in reaching its current asset level of over \$23 million.

The ECU Foundation has certainly fulfilled and exceeded Dr. Wagner's and his colleagues' dream by attracting quality students, and also by bringing outstanding cultural programs to the campus.

In addition, several new facilities have been built with Foundation assistance, and the number of benefactors and their contributions is growing with each passing day.

### JEREMY HARRELL Scholarship

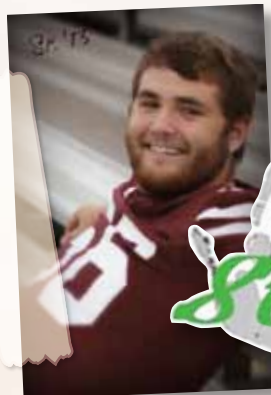

#### Memorial English Scholarship

Her parents, Clifford and Janis Randall, completed the endowment of this scholarship in 2012, and it will be awarded first in Fall 2013.

### JAMES N. ELLIOTT

#### Memorial English Scholarship

Any student who had an English composition class with Jim Elliott (and passed!) knows how to write, and how to write very well! He taught English at OSU, then at ECU from the late 1960s to the mid-1980s. After that, he developed the Adult Continuing Education program at ECU, and finally retired in the mid-1990s. He then ventured into real estate, and spent his spare time as a master bridge player.

After his death in November 2012, his family and friends established this scholarship to assist a deserving English student at ECU.



### JUDY CARROLL

#### Memorial English Scholarship

Judy's family and friends have joined together to establish this scholarship in celebration of her life. She was at Ada High School from 1975 until her retirement in 1998, teaching English for years, and then becoming the guidance counselor. She graduated from ECU with both bachelor's and master's degrees. The first scholarship recipient will be chosen in Fall 2013.



### GLEN CHILDERS Memorial Scholarship

Glen Childers, long-time Ada resident and respected architect, passed away on June 24, 2013. His family and friends have established a scholarship at the ECU Foundation to celebrate his life by assisting deserving students in their academic endeavors.

Glen graduated from Ada High School in 1955, and spent a year working in an oil field. During this time, he was involved in an accident that caused second- and third-degree burns over 65 percent of his body. His recovery was amazing, and he started college at ECU, graduating in 1962. After that he pursued a career in architecture, and earned his state license in 1972. He was also a real estate developer, a licensed pilot, a member of the ECU Alumni Association, and was named an Outstanding Young Oklahoman in 1972.



### HIGGINBOTHAM Family Scholarship

Although the Higginbotham Family Scholarship is not a new one, it has had a "revival" during 2012-2013. Family members of Dorothy C. Higginbotham have joined with the ECU Foundation in celebrating her life, and re-establishing contact with the University and its students.

Dorothy Christine Higginbotham was born March 4, 1927 in Ada, the 3rd youngest in a family of 10. She received her Bachelor of Science degree in speech from East Central State College in 1947. She taught at Duncan High School for four years, and then returned to college, receiving her master's and doctorate degrees in 1956 and 1961 from Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois. With these degrees in Speech Communication, she then spent 1969 and 1970 doing postdoctoral study in psycholinguistics at the University of California at Berkeley.

She began her long career as a college professor first at Southeastern State College in Durant, then on to Southern Illinois University, and finally joined the faculty at the University of Oklahoma in 1978. She retired from OU in 1991 after serving as a Professor of Communication and Associate Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

Dorothy loved to teach, and was always analyzing and explaining things. She was especially interested in early childhood speech development, and although she never married nor had children, she loved being around them.

So why did Dorothy choose ECU over several of the other larger universities as the major beneficiary of her estate? East Central was her original alma mater, and her family has strong ties to the university, with 8 out of 9 of her siblings either receiving degrees from or attending the university. But more importantly, she knew the value of education in people's lives, and recognized the valuable role that a school like ECU can play in education. She knew that smaller schools generally work with smaller budgets, and that her gift would have a greater impact at ECU than at the larger schools.

Because of the size of her gift to the ECU Foundation, each department on campus will be granted a \$1000 Higginbotham Family Scholarship starting in the fall of 2013.

## Golf Tournaments

### VIRGIL TAYLOR Memorial Golf Tournament

Virgil Taylor was a 1970 graduate of East Central University, and obtained his master's degree in rehabilitation counseling from OSU in 1975. He embraced the rehabilitation philosophy and dedicated his life to helping people with disabilities. ECU held a specific place in his heart, and this tournament was organized after his death in 2008 with proceeds going to the Virgil Taylor Rehabilitation Scholarship at the ECU Foundation. This fund assists students at the undergraduate level to pursue a career in vocational rehabilitation counseling, and in three short years reached the centennial endowment level of \$15,000.

### ADA ELKS Lodge Golf Tournament

The Ada Elks Lodge holds an annual golf tournament in the summer of each year to raise money for its scholarship at the Foundation. Over the years, this fund has grown to over \$100,000, and assists at least 5 students per year in attending ECU. The Lodge also holds two pool tournaments per year for the scholarship and to benefit ECU students.



### NIKKI STONECIPHER Memorial Golf Tournament

The eighth annual Nikki Stonecipher Memorial Golf Tournament was not held at its normal time in May or June because of course upgrades at Oak Hills Golf and Country Club in Ada. However, the scholarship fund golf scramble will take place on September 9, 2013 at Oak Hills on a beautiful new course. Proceeds from the scramble go directly to a fund established at the Foundation in Nikki's name which provides tuition, fees, books, and housing for 8 semesters. This scholarship has provided assistance to 18 students for a total of over \$80,000, and total donations including proceeds from last year's tournament reached well over \$500,000.

Nikki and her parents, Brent and Tina Stonecipher, were killed in a tragic plane accident in 2005. Mike Turpen, a good friend of Harland and Shirley Stonecipher (Nikki's grandparents), encouraged them to establish something in Nikki's memory that would keep her legacy alive. Harland and Shirley have truly turned the worst tragedy imaginable into a blessing for so many students! **Watch for lots of pictures in next year's report —**

### DR. TIM GREEN Memorial Golf Tournament

Alums, community members and ECU supporters attended the 2013 Dr. Tim Green Memorial Golf Tournament at the Brent Bruehl Memorial Golf Course in Purcell. Dr. Green (deceased 2011) was ECU's director of athletics from 1981 – 2006, and was also an instructor in reading education early in his career. He was the recipient of numerous honors in both the athletic and educational areas, and oversaw the addition of four sports during his tenure at ECU.

Dr. Gil Morgan, an ECU alum and PGA Champions Tour Professional, has been featured at each of the golf tournaments, and has presented a golf exhibition at each.

The Dr. Tim Green Centennial Scholarship Fund at the ECU Foundation assists with awards to reading specialists and to support athletic programs.

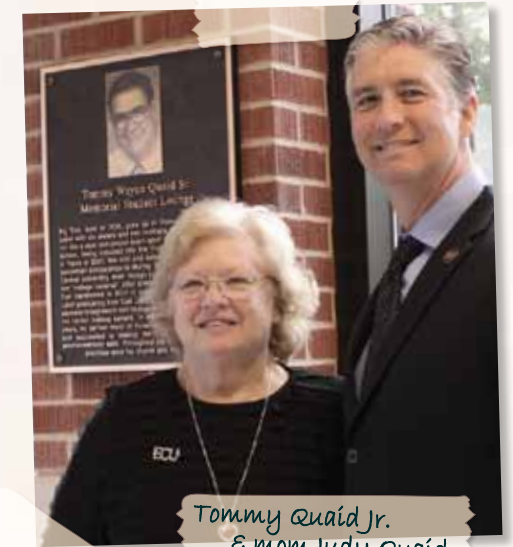
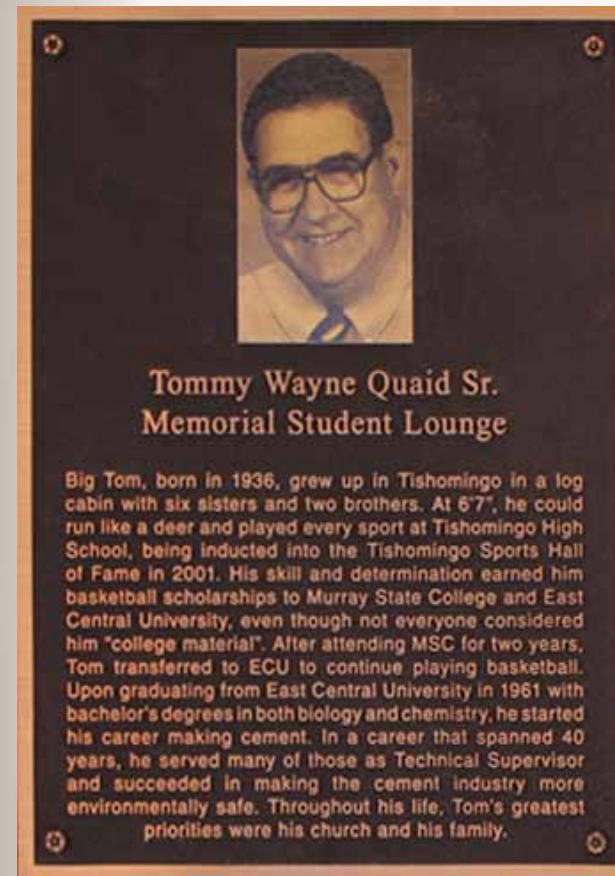
## Quaid Library Lounge Dedication *October 26, 2012*

A generous donation to the ECU Foundation led to the refurbishment of the Linscheid Library's student lounge in 2012. Tommy Wayne Quaid Jr., a 1988 ECU alumnus, donated \$8,000 (\$7,000 toward the library and \$1,000 for a basketball scholarship) and secured a company match from his employer, NetApp Inc., of \$8,000 to purchase window shades, rugs, leather couches and chairs, and two dining/study tables with chairs. The updates to the lounge had been a vision of Dr. Adrianna Lancaster, dean of the Linscheid Library, who is a long-time friend of Tommy's. The dedication ceremony, held

on October 26, 2012, unveiled a plaque which named the lounge after Tommy's father, Tommy Wayne Quaid Sr.

Tommy Sr. was a 1961 ECU alum, and spent two years at ECU after transferring from Murray State College. Tommy Sr., like his son, played basketball at ECU and graduated with degrees in biology and chemistry. He grew up in Tishomingo, and at 6 feet, 7 inches, played excellent basketball and was inducted into the Tishomingo Sports Hall of Fame in the early 1990s. His skill and determination earned him basketball scholarships to both Murray State and ECU.

"This gift will have a lasting impact. It's a great space for students," said Lancaster.



## Memorial Benches

Because of the beautiful trees, shaded sidewalks, and history of the area, the Frank Crabtree Honor Plaza on the west side of Science Hall has become a place to honor former ECU faculty and staff, distinguished alumni, and others who have provided significant service or contribution to the University.



**Dr. Norman Frame** came to ECU in 1964 from Fort Hays State in Fort Hays, Kan. Originally from Checotah, Okla., he attended Northeastern State University and later obtained both his master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Oklahoma. He taught at ECU for 33 years, and served as director of elementary education and also taught math, reading and language arts for teacher preparation. Since his retirement in 1997, Norman and his wife Mary Ann have continued to reside in Ada.

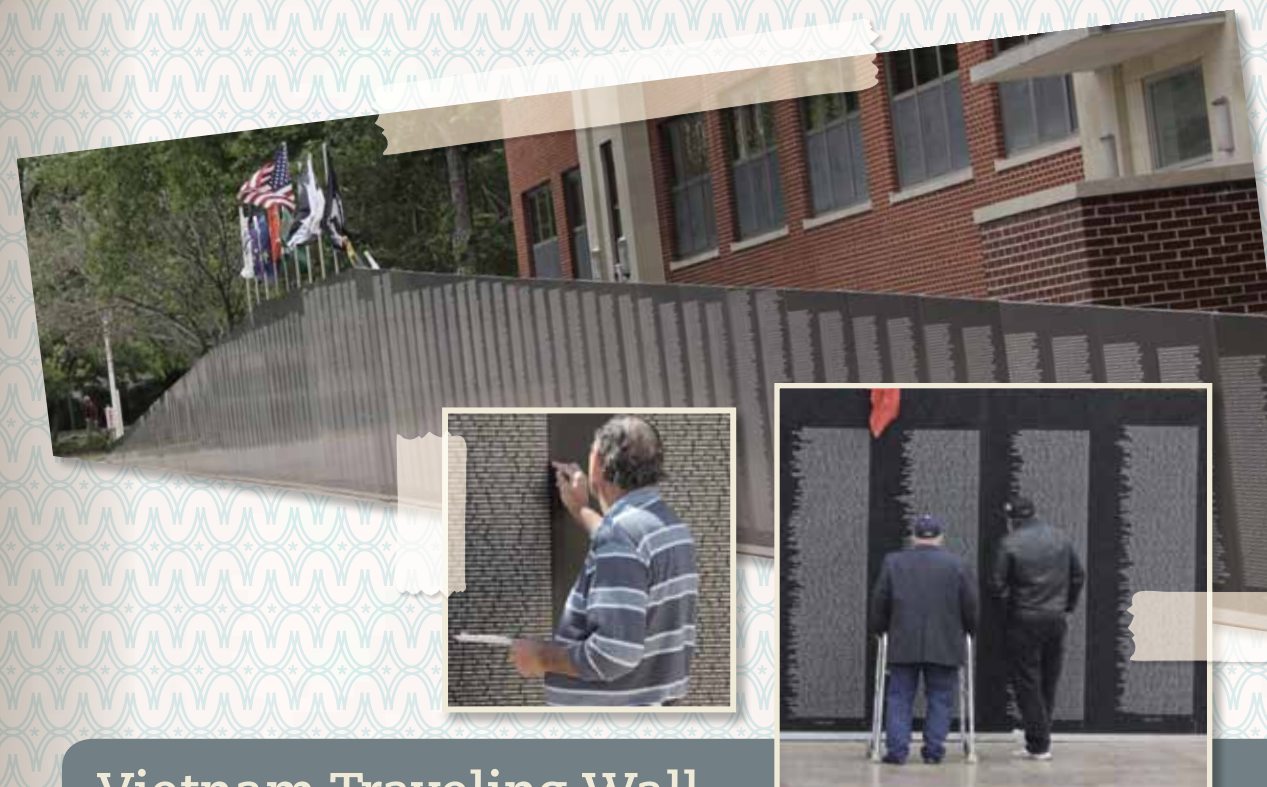
**Dr. John Bulman's** tenure at ECU spanned 50 years. He taught physics, served as a department chair and division head, and completed his ECU career as the vice president of academic affairs. Immediately following retirement, Dr. Bulman served ECU as the campus' project director on numerous new building and restoration projects, including the construction of the Hallie Brown Ford Fine Arts Center. John and his wife, the late Berta Nelson Bulman, have two children, both ECU alumni: Suzanne Bulman Coyle and John David Bulman. Dr. Bulman passed away in November 2011 at the age of 82.



**Dr. Joe Parsons** served ECU for 35 years in numerous capacities. He returned to his alma mater in 1966 to teach in the College of Education, and later became vice president of student affairs, then vice president for development. Immediately following the announcement of his retirement in 1998, Dr. Parsons was contacted by the Board of Regional Oklahoma Colleges and was asked to become the interim president at ECU. He held this position during the 1988-1989 academic year. He and his wife Harol Deane were the parents of ECU alumni Paula Kedy, Penny Martin, and Patrick Parsons. Dr. Parsons passed away in October 2011.



**Mr. Kenneth Clinton** graduated from ECU with a master of education degree in 1960, and was an elementary school teacher for several years. In 1966, Mr. Clinton became the manager of the ECU Bookstore, a position he held until 1985. He and his wife Hazel had five sons: Larry, Phillip, John, Gary, and Tim. Mr. Clinton died in December 2012 at the age of 89.

## Foundation Projects

### Involvement and Assistance

#### SCIENCE EQUIPMENT CHALLENGE

In late 2011, Dr. Bruce Weems informed the Foundation and Advancement staff of the need for a new autoclave in the science department. An anonymous donor quickly gave \$5,000 toward this purchase, and promised another \$5,000 as soon as other fundraising was complete. The matching amount was received, and the new autoclave was purchased in August 2012.



#### 2012 MILAM AWARD

#### THE RAMADAN FAMILY

A \$250,000 gift from the Dr. Raniyah Ramadan Foundation will help provide a state-of-the-art research facility and program for undergraduate students. This gift, plus additional grant funds, will provide the bulk of the funding for the Dr. Raniyah Ramadan Center for Undergraduate Research and Learning which will include two undergraduate research labs for biology, and one each for chemistry, environmental health science and psychology. The Center is currently under construction on the lower level of the Education Building.



Also, the first Dr. Raniyah Ramadan Symposium was held in Estep Auditorium on January 31, 2013. There were four researchers who presented the following topics: *Central Mechanisms Regulating Visceral Pain*, *Molecular Pathogenesis of Severe Bacterial Endophthalmitis*, *Exploring the Role of Caveolin-1 in Retinal Physiology and Pathophysiology*, and *Cerium Oxide Nanoparticles Inhibit Retinoblastoma*.



#### ECU CHORALE

Under the direction of Dr. J. Steven Walker, the ECU Chorale was chosen as a university level honor group for 2013 by the Oklahoma Music Educators Association, and performed at the state convention in January.

"A Very Chorale Christmas" was a night of food and fun to benefit the Chorale which is planning a trip to Washington, D.C. in December 2013. The Chorale will perform as a part

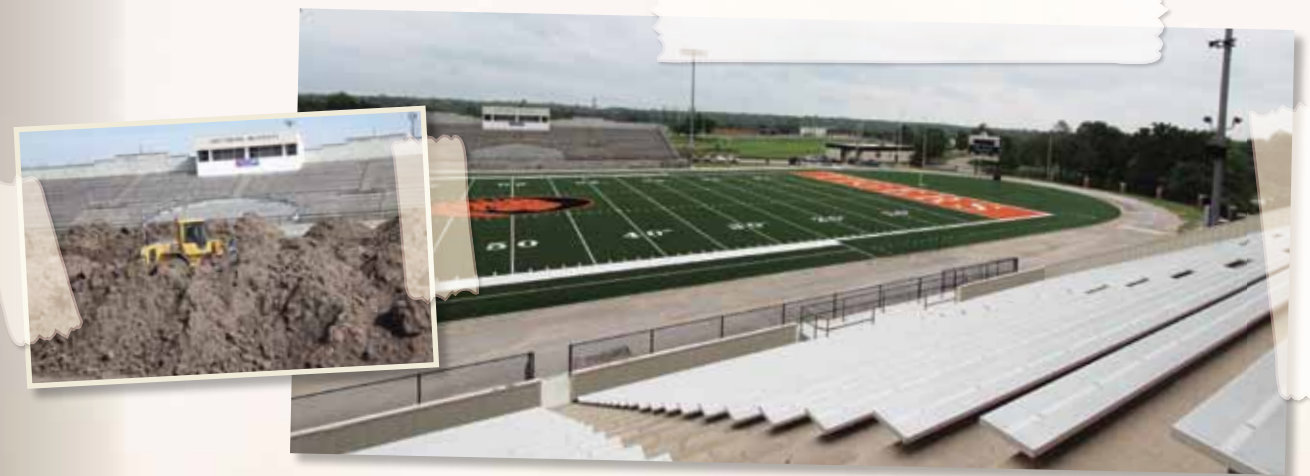
of the 150th Commemoration of the American Civil in the National Festival of the States.

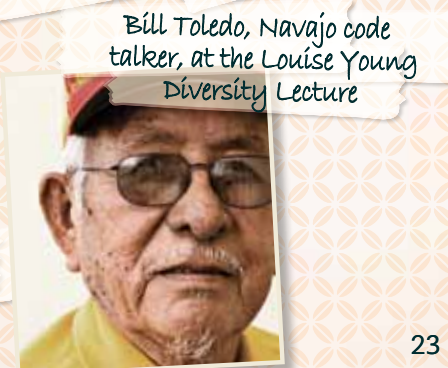

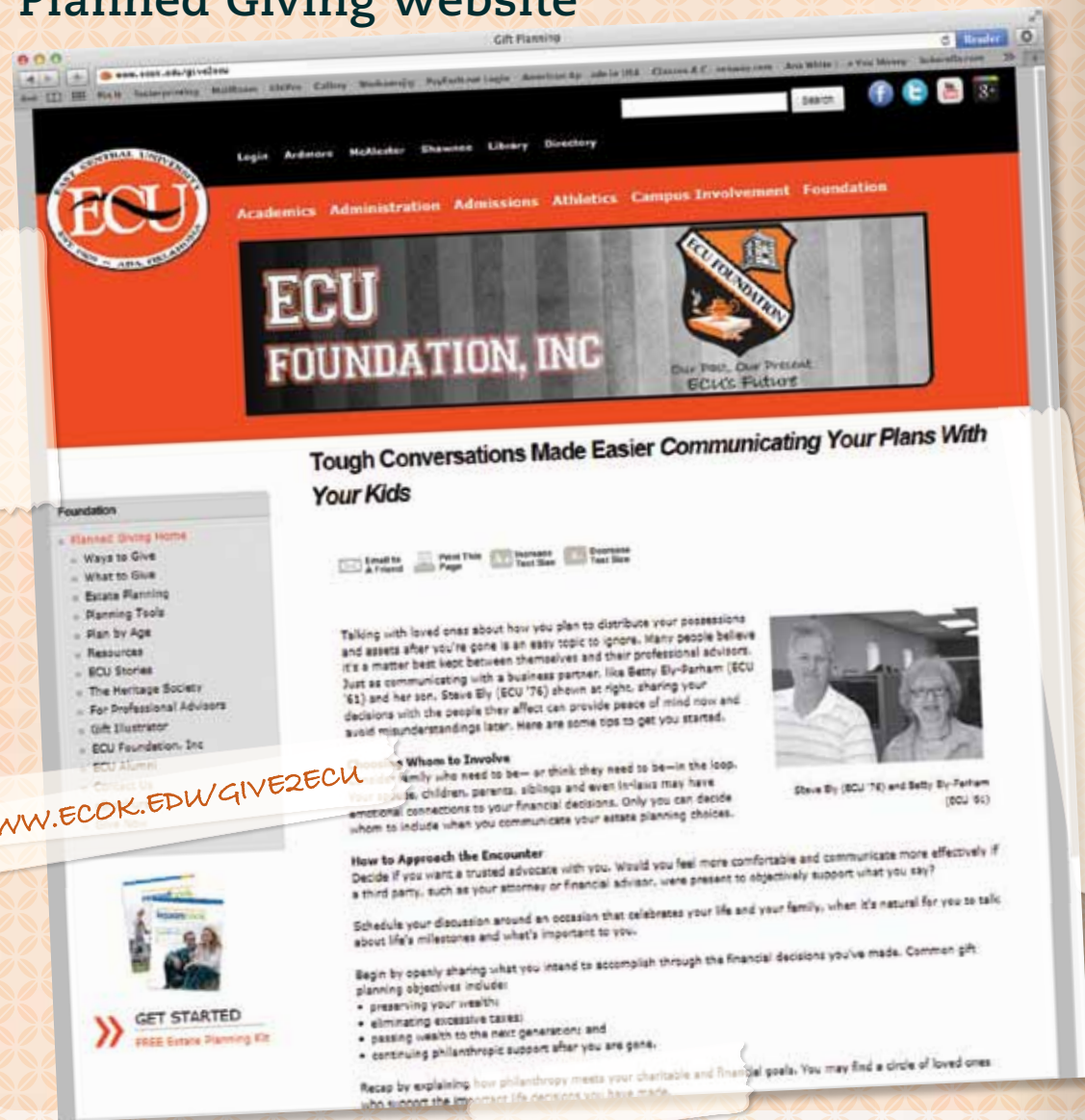

## How an Endowment Works

- : A donor gives to the Foundation to establish a named endowed scholarship in an area of his or her passion. The minimum amount for a Foundation Endowment is \$10,000, while the minimum for Centennial Endowment recognition is \$15,000.
- : The donor works with the Foundation to develop criteria for the scholarship and guidelines for the distribution. A scholarship agreement is signed by both parties.
- : The gift is entered into the ECU Foundation Endowment fund.
- : The Foundation's Investment committee invests the donor's gift in accordance with the Foundation's investment objectives to maximize returns and minimize risk.
- : A portion of the earnings on the invested funds will be used for distribution as scholarships to students, while the fund's principal amount remains intact.
- : By reinvesting the remainder of the earnings, the scholarship continues to grow and is protected from inflation, providing annual support to ECU's students for decades to come.

## Gifts to the Foundation

### How Can I Give to the Foundation?

Donors give to the Foundation for many different reasons. Some want to repay the investment that others made in them. Some want to give a gift that adds value to the University, and that also brings deeper meaning to their lives. Some simply want to support the ECU family and make a positive impact on faculty, staff and students of the future. Whatever the reason, donor gifts are important to the Foundation and to the University, and we want to make sure that you are aware of all of the different ways that you can donate.

The Foundation will accept any level of gift, and in all cases, the wishes of the donor will be the guiding principal as to how the funds are used. Donors frequently specify an endowed scholarship, academic department fund, endowed lectureship/professionship/chair or capital improvement project as the target of their benevolence.

The Foundation encourages you to discuss the various methods of giving with your accountant and/or attorney in order to select the giving mechanism which best fits your circumstances. Flexible options allow you to demonstrate your commitment and maximize your support of the University's mission. The most common types of gifts are:

### GIFTS OF CASH, CHECK, OR CREDIT CARD

These gifts are always welcome because they are available immediately to strengthen the Foundation and the University or begin earning income for the future.

### GIFTS OF SECURITIES

These gifts include stocks, bonds, mutual funds and IRAs, and are also available immediately to impact the work of the Foundation.

### GIFTS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

Personal property can include coin collections, antique cars, gun collections, artwork, musical instruments, etc.

### GIFTS OF REAL PROPERTY

Real estate, homes, business property and farmland that have grown in value can result in capital gains taxes if sold, or tax advantages are available through a charitable gift to the Foundation. When the Foundation acquires your gift of appreciated stock or property, you receive a tax deduction equal to its fair market value and also avoid costly capital gains tax on the increase in value.

### GIFTS-IN-KIND

Donations of software, licenses, services, vendor products, and other property also support the mission and programs of ECU. These gifts-in-kind allow the Foundation to use its resources for other needs while you get credit for your support.

### GIFTS OF TRUSTS

This can include charitable remainder trusts, unitrusts, lead trusts, family trusts, annuity trusts, etc., that can avoid capital gains taxes and provide an annual income for life.

### GIFTS OF INSURANCE

Naming the Foundation as the owner and beneficiary of your life insurance policy is also an option, especially when your policy has a face amount that is much greater than the amount you could afford to give in cash. By assigning ownership to the Foundation and making the Foundation the beneficiary of an old policy that is no longer needed for its original purpose, such as sheltering children's education, you can make a substantial gift at a low cost and take an immediate income tax deduction for the value of the policy. You can then contribute an amount equal to the policy's premiums to the Foundation and deduct that gift as a charitable contribution. Proceeds of the policy will pass to the Foundation free of estate taxes. New policies may also be obtained listing the Foundation as the owner and/or beneficiary as a part of financial or estate planning.

## The Ultimate Gift

The will is the most widely used estate-planning tool in America today. A simple document that is easily drafted and updated, it remains the most popular method of planned giving, for almost every charity, including the ECU Foundation.

There are five types of charitable bequests you can make when directing all or part of your estate to the Foundation:

**General Bequest:** an agreed-upon dollar amount.

**Specific Bequest:** a specific, identified property or security, including real estate, stocks, or bonds.

**Residuary Bequest:** all or a portion of an estate's property after all debts, taxes, expenses and other bequests have been made.

**Contingent Bequest:** the Foundation serves as an alternate beneficiary in case a beneficiary dies or disclaims a bequest.

**Restricted Bequest:** any of the above bequests with a specific purpose for the property, such as establishing a scholarship or endowment.

While a will can be a simple and effective option for many, a living trust might allow assets to be distributed to heirs without the delays or costs of probate. *Be sure to consult with a qualified professional before you draft your will or trust, and review it often.*

### JERRY & MAMIE FARNHAM

A gift from Mamie Farnham after Jerry's death in 2006 and a subsequent gift from Mamie after her death in 2012 are excellent examples of the "Ultimate Gift."

Jerry and Mamie met at a bridge game his first semester at ECU in 1951. They played both bridge and canasta throughout their college years, marrying while they were still in school and starting a family shortly after that. Jerry served as the City Finance Director in Ada, Okla. for 30 years, while Mamie worked as Ada's Chamber of Commerce Executive Director, also for 30 years. They have two children, a daughter in California and a son in Pauls Valley, Okla.

They both retired at age 58 and began traveling the US in their travel trailer. They visited all of the states except Alaska and Hawaii during their 15 years of travel, and only stopped when Jerry became ill.

Mamie established the Jerry Farnham Centennial Accounting Scholarship at the ECU Foundation, Inc. in memory of her husband. "Even though it took him 20 years to complete his accounting degree at ECU, he was dedicated to the university and what it had provided to him and his family," stated Mamie. She wanted to start this scholarship because both she and Jerry knew the value of a good education, and they were



fortunate enough to be able to give back to the school which meant so much to them!

After Mamie's death in 2012, the Farnham Living Trust designated over \$100,000 to the ECU Foundation to be added to the scholarship. Accounting students for years to come will benefit from the Farnham's generosity and their appreciation of the value of higher education.

# The Circle of Annual Giving

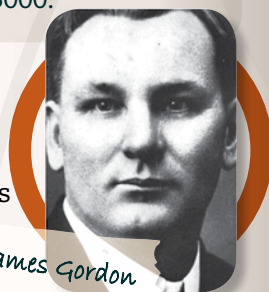
